
## Trumpet Fingering Chart Also for Cornet, Flugelhorn, or Baritone treble clef



These are the most common fingerings for the notes. You can use alternate fingerings for some notes, but they may be a bit out of tune or may sound less clear. For example, first space F# may be fingered 2 or 123. Fourth space E may be fingered 0, 12, 123 or 3.

A natural sign (\$) cancels out the flat or sharp. A double sharp (\*) raises the note two half-steps. A double flat (\$\psi\$) lowers the note two half-steps. So a G\* would be fingered as an A. A G\$\psi\$ is the same as an F.
